




December 2023 E-Newsletter

MIDLAND ANCESTORS AT THE BMI THE ROYAL WARWICKSHIRE REGIMENT

1914-18 - IN BOOKS AND CARTOONS

Saturday 2 December at 2pm

Presenters: Paul Jacques and David Vaux

Men from the RWR played a major role on the Western Front in WWI. The regiment lost 11,610 men; six were awarded the Victoria Cross for outstanding bravery.

Paul and David's presentation and display will raise our awareness of the wealth of printed material available to family history researchers. This takes us beyond the bare facts in official records to gain an insight into the contemporary experiences, feelings, and memories of not only

those who served but also the impact upon their families, neighbourhood and society.

Paul and Dave have a keen interest in the Royal Warwickshire Regiment and Birmingham in both wars. Dave has been exhibiting since 1994 and Paul joined him in 2014 at the start of the First World War Centenary. Paul & Dave have exhibited at the City Museum and Art Gallery, Birmingham University, the Oratory, schools and church and community halls locally and further afield.

In 2014 with their help, Dave's old school, now Tudor Grange Academy, Kingshurst, built a trench in their Outdoor Learning centre. A website followed and numerous school groups have toured the trench.







NEW YEAR FAMILY HISTORY DISCOVERY COURSES AT STAFFORDSHIRE LIBRARIES



Family History Discovery courses will be running at various South Staffordshire Libraries in the New Year.

Designed for beginners and those who have researched a little but don't know what to do next but also excellent as a refresher for anyone who has returned to family history research after a break or who has not researched using online records.

These are FREE five week courses, run by Penny Smith our Wolverhampton Group leader, for the Staffordshire Library Service so booking *must* be made with the relevant library. Each session will be approximately two and a half to three hours for five consecutive weekly sessions.

A different topic is covered each week, there are handouts and guidance, with opportunities to ask questions - all in small friendly groups.

Participants will look at records from England & Wales and find out how to tell the story of their family through various documents.

Penny has been researching her own family history for over 40 years since learning from her father that his uncle went to prison and nobody knew why because 'no one will talk about it'. She uses certificates and documents from her own research to demonstrate the process and show participants how to trace family lines back to the early 1800's and tell the story of their families.

The Family Histories Podcast is an independent podcast hosted by family historian Andrew Martin.





Each episode features an interview with a genealogy-addicted guest, finding out about how they got hooked on family history, how they research, and their challenges and thoughts on the genealogy industry. The guest then shares a life story of one of the most fascinating relatives they've uncovered in their research, before facing the dreaded brick wall – where

they make a plea to listeners for help with solving one of their pesky brick walls. Each episode sees Andrew offer to help the guest with their research in his (shh: secret time machine) in his garage. EP5 - 'The Churchwarden' with Jackie Depelle - out 5th Dec

Where family history teacher and course tutor Jackie Depelle shares how she traced her ancestors who built her house, and held positions of responsibility in the community.

EP6 - 'The Runaway' with Teresa Vega - out 12th Dec

Where family historian and anthropologist Teresa Vega shares the story of her runaway ancestor as one of the last enslaved people in her area.

EP7 - 'The Loyalist' with James Danter - out 19th Dec

Where professional archaeologist and family historian James Danter finds a solicitor in his wife's family tree, and decides to join a fight he cannot win in the American War of Independence.

EP8 - The Reminder (Bonus Episode) - out Christmas Eve

Andrew is visited by three ghosts, but what is their message?
