

DNA testing company MyHeritage has launched the first whole genome sequencing product aimed at general consumers.

The upgrade will enable MyHeritage to offer deeper insights into ethnic origins, family connections and genetic genealogy. Customers will also be able to download their entire genome at no extra cost in CRAM format.

Most current commercial DNA tests only read about 700,000 base pairs of nucleotides, looking for shared patterns. Whole genome sequencing will read around three billion base pairs giving unprecedented insight into our genetic code.
